GENERAL COURSE OUTLINE

Suggested Prerequisites: A valid Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation license and a high school diploma or GED.

Course Level: Introductory

Course Description: An overview of the skills and knowledge necessary for the field of instruction of cosmetology students.

End-Of-Course Outcomes: Identify the laws and rules of the state licensing agency; explain teaching methodologies and lesson plan development. Upon completion of this course the student will:

- Possess knowledge of the rules and regulations of South Plains College, this department and the state.
- Demonstrate teaching methodologies.
- Identify major points in lesson plan development.
