

Economically Disadvantaged: Based on one of the following 1) annual income at or below federal poverty line, 2) eligibility for Aid to Families with Dependent Children or other public assistance programs, 3) receipt of a Pell Grant or comparable state program of need-based financial assistance, 4) participation or eligible for JTPA programs included under Title II, and 5) eligible for benefits under the Food Stamp Act of 1977 or Health and Human Services (HHS) Poverty Guidelines, 403.114, page 36721 of final Rule and Regulations.

Individual with Disabilities: Typically self-reported or reported when a student receives special services through a special population coordinator or a state program. Students referred to the college by Texas Rehabilitation Commission for education and training are reported in this category.

Limited English Proficiency (LEP): All students who enroll in LEP courses or who were determined, based on a local placement test, to be Limited English Proficient.

Programs to Eliminate Gender Bias: Technical programs with more than 75% of one gender in a single program.

Displaced Homemaker: Self-reported or students who receive special federally funded or state-funded assistance because they are displaced homemakers and students who receive special services through a Perkins Coordinator may be reported in this category.

Single Parent: Self-reported data, or students who receive special federally-funded or state-funded assistance (such as referrals from the Texas Department of Human Services or the Texas Department of Health) because they are single parents may also be reported in this category.




